DARIAH is a pan-European digital research infrastructure for arts and humanities research

- Launched and added to the ESFRI Roadmap 2006
- Formally constituted as a European Research Infrastructure Consortium (ERIC) in 2014
- ESFRI Landmark since 2016



DARIAH's **mission** is to empower research communities with digital methods to create, connect and share knowledge about culture and society. •Sharing knowledge to create new connections and insight, through networking, training and projects •Sharing **tools** to promote the work of others with similar research questions •Sharing **data** to allow new projects to start from a higher baseline Sharing networks to build key relationships and seek funding •Sharing a **voice** to be heard in European and national policy debates

The Marketplace highlights and showcases solutions and research practices for every step of the SSH research data life cycle. It is **sustained** by a joint effort between CESSDA, CLARIN, and DARIAH and an **Editorial Board**.

- gain access to useful and well-curated resources

- become actively involved in the SSH community data curation routines, by being a basic contributor or an advanced curator

- DARIAH's proven expertise in the process of applying for European funding acts as a force multiplier In 2022, DARIAH Partners leveraged 24.4 million euros (23.7 million in 2021)
